WWI Puts New High School Plans on Hold

By 1915, extreme crowding and unsafe conditions at Owatonna High School on Main Street had become a real concern. Students joked about it in their newspapers and shared many opinions on it.

The first high school building burned down in 1882 and was replaced by a brick building at the same location. Both buildings occupied the former Washington Elementary site.

Owatonna passed a \$250,000 referendum in 1916 to build a new high school and hired local architects Jacobson and Jacobson, OHS graduates, to design plans for the building on Grove and School Streets. When America went to war, the new school construction was delayed until the country returned to normalcy.

In 1920, another \$250,000 referendum passed to

cover the increased building costs. Ground broke for the new school in April 1920. The new school included a gym and a swimming pool, with plenty of space for students. The community took great pride in the building they constructed.

Old Traditions, New Garments

As the 2017 Owatonna High School Carolers embarked upon a busy December packed with performances, they wore new robes for the first time in four decades. In a nod to history, the style of the robes has not changed. The new robes, however, are lighter, fit better, and are designed to offer more freedom of movements and gestures.

The OHS Christmas Carolers came into existence in the 1940s. The group was

organized by Carol Marx, publisher of the Owatonna Photo News. They did not have the long robes during those early years; they wore their own coats and scarves, plus the boys wore long underwear that was dyed either red or green. In 1947 they were outfitted with corduroy tams and long, red or green capes. For a number of years they walked from the high school to their performances and back, until at some point in the 1950s, a kindly Owatonna bus driver began donating his time off to bus them around town.
